

**RECREATION LEADER II/BUILDING MONITOR

JOB DESCRIPTION**

JOB SUMMARY: Assists with tasks related to daily program administration at the department, including but not limited to the day camp, sports, senior, and other activities. Interacts with program participants, coaches and parents. Serves as counselors, assists with after school, summer camp, senior activities, set up and break down for special events and special programs.

SUPERVISION EXERCISED: None. Depending on the program assigned, individuals in this position may perform direct supervision and security of the participants.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Serves as a liaison between officials, parents, participants and other department staff responsible for implementing the programs.
- Acts as a representative of the department; assists by responding to inquiries by the public and requests for help by full-time program staff.
- Gathers equipment needed for a program; checks equipment for safe operation. Distributes equipment to the coaches, participants and officials.
- Reports unsafe conditions immediately to supervisor and assists with reducing safety hazards to participants.
- Completes Village accident/incident reports and other reports or administrative memoranda associated with the program in a timely manner, including but not limited to behavior modification reports to parents, posting rain-out messages, standings and notices.
- Assists with all activities related to programs or events as assigned. Sets up and takes down tables, chairs and other items needed for events and/or programs. Cleans area upon the conclusion of the program or event.
- Participates in team approach to department tasks, responds to management directives, follows professional protocol, and coordinates work with other department staff as needed.

OTHER DUTIES:

- Performs other related duties as required.

DESIRED MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

Education and Experience:

- High school diploma or equivalent.
- Any related combination of training and experience.

Knowledge, Skills and Abilities:

- Some knowledge of the basic principles and practices of recreation or a related field.
- Ability to participate in a team approach to management; ability to follow directives and professional protocol.
- Ability to recognize safety hazards, and when found ability to reduce such hazards.
- Ability to take responsibility for a wide variety of tasks; ability to organize projects and meet deadlines.
- Ability to effectively communicate orally and in writing.
- Ability to make decisions.
- Ability to maintain effective working relationships with other employees, and the general public.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS:

- Valid Florida State driver's license or ability to obtain one by the date of hire.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS:

The physical demands described here are representative of those that must be met by an employee to successfully perform the essential functions of this job. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions.

While performing the duties of this job, the employee is frequently required to stand, walk, sit, talk, hear, and use hands to manipulate, handle, feel or operate objects, tools, or controls, and reach with hands and arms. The employee is frequently required to climb, walk up and down staircases, balance, stoop, kneel, crouch, or crawl.

The employee must regularly lift and/or move up to 30 pounds, frequently lift and/or move up to 50 pounds, and occasionally lift and/or move up to 60 pounds dead weight with knees extended and bending from the waist. Objects include tables, chairs, podiums, benches, and other equipment. Specific vision abilities required by this job include close vision, distant vision, color vision, peripheral vision, depth perception, and ability to adjust focus. In addition, the employee must be able to rotate neck frequently, extend arms overhead frequently, and turn completely around from fixed stance.

TOOLS & EQUIPMENT USED:

Custodial and general facilities maintenance materials and equipment, computer, other items commonly used in the department programs, activities and events.

ENVIRONMENTAL CONDITIONS:

The work environment characteristics described here are representative of those an employee encounters while performing the essential functions of this job. Reasonable

accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions.

While performing the duties of this job, the employee frequently works in outside weather conditions, and is occasionally exposed to wet and/or humid conditions, toxic or caustic chemicals, such as cleaning chemicals. The noise level in the work environment is moderately noisy to loud occasionally for certain programs, activities and events.

SELECTION GUIDELINES:

Formal application, evaluation of education, training and experience; oral interview and reference check; job related tests may be required.

The duties listed above are intended only as illustrations of the various types of work that may be performed. The omission of specific statements of duties does not exclude them from the position if the work is similar, related or a logical assignment to the position.

The job description does not constitute an employment agreement between the employer and employee, and is subject to change by the employer as the needs of the employer and requirements of the job change.
